

Resolution of Tbilisi First International Symposium

The First International Symposium was held in October 16-20, 1992 in Tbilisi (Georgia). The symposium was organized by the Georgian SSR Ministry of Health and the State Medical Institute. Representatives of Georgia SSR, the United States, Russia, Czechoslovakia and Italy took part into the symposium work. Among them were 117 from Georgia and 12 from abroad.

5 plenary sessions took place during the symposium was held, at which were presented 82 scientific works, they included critical care medicine topical issues, including medical aspects of the tragedy of the ninth of April in Tbilisi.

Symposium unanimously determined:

1. Be approved the Ministry of Health, Tbilisi State Medical Institute, Department of Anesthesiology and Reanimatology of Central Republic Hospital work in the tragedy of the ninth of April in Tbilisi medical consequences of the liquidation order.
2. The Ministry of Health, the Association of Disaster (Catastrophe) and Critical Care Medicine of Georgia, ensure (provide) the creation of Critical Care Medicine Service in Georgia.
3. To be formulated in Tbilisi the international teaching, scientific and practical center of Critical Care and Catastrophe Medicine.
4. The Ministry of Health, as well as the Association of Catastrophe and Critical Care Medicine of Georgia, has to start to work on the liquidation of a global disasters, International Medical Brigades Train and work towards finding the optimal program and the creation of such a brigades.

Resolution of Tbilisi Second International Symposium

The Second International Symposium was held in November 16-20, 2010 in Tbilisi (Georgia). The symposium was organized by the Ministry of Labor, Health and Social Defense of Georgia, the Critical Care Medicine Institute of Georgia, Tbilisi State Medical University, Department of Critical Care Medicine, Academy of Medical Sciences and Disaster and Critical Care Medicine Association of Georgia. Critical Care Medicine leading specialists from Georgia, USA, Germany, Japan, Egypt and India took part into the symposium work.

There were performed three plenary meetings at symposium. During the plenary sessions were reported up to 30 scientific works, which were devoted to topical problems of Critical Care Medicine. Thematic discussion sessions were held in the form of experts, which also discussed the limited resources during the critical issues of medical service organization, as well as the journal "Critical Care and Catastrophe Medicine's" editorial board meeting.

It was dealt the resolution at the final day of the symposium, which the participants adopted unanimously. In the form of the resolution Tbilisi Second International Symposium declares:

1. To be approved an exclusive model of Critical Care Medicine Department, developed in Critical Care Medicine Institute of Georgia, and to be given recommendation to the developing countries to create a Critical Medical Services, as well as the use during the global military conflicts and disasters.
2. To be approved the Scientific Research work of Critical Care Medicine Institute of Georgia - before unknown mechanisms and forms of identification of the death, also about Progenitor Precursor Committing with critical patient, the Subconscious processes management in critical patients and other. To be given recommendation to the Institute of Critical Care Medicine of Georgia to make and deepen more intensive the direction of scientific researches.
3. To be approved scientific - research work presented by the scientists of the United States, Japan, Germany, Egypt and India participating in the symposium and given the recommendation to the Critical Care Medicine Institute of Georgia about deepen a joint scientific practical cooperation with the mentioned institutions.
5. To be approved the journal "Critical Care and Catastrophe Medicine's" editorial board work, who helped mentioned journal in the nearest time period (5 years) to be established internationally

recognized reviewing kind of non-profit (commercial) scientific practice edition. To request editorial board members of the journal "Critical Care and Catastrophe Medicine" to develop further cooperation in order to raise the level of academic improvement and quality of the journal

Tbilisi International Symposium on "New steps in Critical Care Medicine" has to become traditional, and to be held every three year in the first decade of October in Tbilisi. Note to be taken, that the organizational issues of the symposium will be resolved by the Critical Care Medicine Institute of Georgia.
